2020 Heldt Prize Nominations**

The Association for Women in Slavic Studies invites nominations for the 2020 competition for the Heldt Prizes, awarded for works of scholarship. To be eligible for nomination, all books and articles for the first three prize categories must be published between 15 April 2019 and 15 April 2020. Nominations for the 2020 prizes will be accepted for the following categories:

- Best book in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies
- Best book by a woman in any area of Slavic/East European/Eurasian studies
- Best article in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies

Instructions for nominating books. One may nominate individual books for more than one category, and more than one item for each category. In general, hard copy submissions are preferred over e-versions. The prizes will be awarded at the AWSS meeting at the ASEES National Convention in Washington, DC in November 2020.
