To be eligible for nomination, all books and articles must be in English; works of scholarship must be published between 15 April 2020 and 15 April 2021 and translations between 15 April 2019 and 15 April 2021. Nominations for the 2021 prizes will be accepted for the following categories:

- Best book in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies
- Best book by a woman in any area of Slavic/East European/Eurasian studies
- Best translation in Slavic/East European/Eurasian women's and gender studies
- Best article in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies

**Instructions for nominating translations.** The Heldt Translation Prize is awarded biennially for the best book-length translation of literary work by a woman (from a Slavic/East European/Eurasian language into English). To be eligible for nomination, all translations must be published between 15 April 2019 and 15 April 2021. The prize will be awarded at the AWSS meeting at the ASEES National Convention in New Orleans in November 2021.
