The Association for Women in Slavic Studies invites nominations for the 2022 competition for the Heldt Prizes, awarded for works of scholarship and translations. To be eligible for nomination, all books and articles must be in English; works of scholarship must be published between 15 April 2021 and 15 April 2022. Nominations for the 2022 prizes will be accepted for the following categories:

- Best book by a woman-identifying scholar in any area of Slavic/East European/Eurasian studies
- Best book in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies
- Best article in Slavic/Eastern European/Eurasian women's and gender studies

The prizes will be awarded at the AWSS meeting at the ASEES National Convention in Chicago in November 2022.
