As can be seen by this bibliographical compilation, which brings together the latest scholarship over the past ten or so years, the word "decolonization" and its variants have become more prevalent but not completely supplanted in the fruitful conversations that have emerged since Russia's ruthless full-scale invasion in February 2022. By bringing materials together in one place, this bibliography is intended to foster further those conversations. Its creation was made possible in part by the 2023 financial support of an ASEES internship for Caroline Prout.
